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the philokalia is a collection of texts written between the fourth and fifteenth centuries by spiritual masters of the orthodox christian tradition first published in greek in 1782 translated into slavonic and later into russian the philokalia has exercised an influence far greater than that of any book other than the bible in the recent history of the orthodox church

the eastern christian love of the beautiful can be a companion on your own spiritual journey a collection of writings by monks from the fourth to fifteenth centuries the philokalia more than any other text reflects the eastern church's interpretation of the bible's meaning simply translated the title means love of the beautiful which reflects the text's emphasis on mystical and contemplative practices to engage all of our senses in the acts of worship and prayer this introduction to the wisdom of the philokalia illuminates a text that until now has intimidated the general reader in its scholarly

translations from greek and russian allyne smith focuses his thoughtful selection on seven themes that recur throughout the five volume work repentance the heart prayer the jesus prayer the passions stillness and theosis smith s enlightening accessible facing page commentary fills in the historical and spiritual context clarifies core teachings including the eastern understanding of salvation and draws connections to modern day practices such as contemplative prayer now you can experience the spiritual wisdom of the philokalia even if you have no previous knowledge of eastern christianity this skylight illuminations edition takes you on a journey through this beloved text showing you how the teachings of eastern monks can help you become by grace what god is by nature

the philokalia literally love of the beautiful is after the bible the most influential source of spiritual tradition within the orthodox church first published in greek in 1782 by st nicodemos of the holy mountain and st macarios of corinth the philokalia includes works by thirty six influential orthodox authors such as maximus the confessor peter of madascus symeon the new theologian and gregory palamas surprisingly this important collection of theological and spiritual writings has received little scholarly attention with the growing interest in orthodox theology the need for a substantive resource for philokalic studies has become increasingly evident the purpose of the present volume is to remedy that lack by providing an ecumenical collection of scholarly essays on the philokalia that will introduce readers to its background motifs authors and relevance for contemporary life and thought

the philokalia is a collection of texts on prayer and the spiritual life written between the fourth and fifteenth centuries by masters of the orthodox christian tradition first published in greek in 1782 translated into slavonic and later into russian this is the first complete translation into english it is made from the original greek and will be completed in five volumes volume iv contains some of the most important writings in the entire collection st symeon the new theologian speaks about the conscious experience of the holy spirit and about the vision of the divine and uncreated light st gregory of sinai provides practical guidance concerning the life of the hesychast and the use of the jesus prayer st gregory palamas discusses the distinction between the essence and the energies of god

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and union with god only a selection of texts from the philokalia has been available hitherto in english the present rendering which is a completely new translation is designed to appear in five volumes the first of these was published by faber faber in 1979 the second volume consists mainly of writings from the seventh century in particular by st maximus the confessor the greater part of which has never before been translated into english as in the first volume the editors have provided introductory notes to each of the writers a glossary of key terms and a detailed index

this beginner s guide to the great five volume classic of eastern orthodox spirituality studies the many concepts addressed in the philokalia each chapter focuses on a single spiritual concept explaining it as simply as possible chapters include watchfulness nepsis logismoi thoughts ascesis theosis the passion stillness hesychia the jesus prayer etc a superb introduction to the philokalia easy to read

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the philokalia a collection of spiritual texts by fathers of the eastern church spanning the fourth to the fifteenth centuries was first published in venice in 1782 significant in bringing about a renaissance of orthodox spirituality since then it shows deep psychological as well as spiritual awareness the philokalia and the inner life critically examines the nature of mental and spiritual well being as understood in the philokalia it identifies the passions as hostile pleasures with a seductive and addictive quality which are detrimental to human well being and explores the remedies for the passions that the philokalia prescribes like the philokalia contemporary psychotherapies seek to interpret

human thoughts and restore well being although the talking cure of secular psychotherapy contrasts significantly with the praying cure of the philokalia this book is for all who are interested in spirituality theology and the life of prayer as well as students of the philokalia it is also for clinicians counselors and psychotherapists especially those who wish to explore the relationship between psychological and spiritual well being

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the philokalia a seminal anthology in eastern orthodox christianity is a collection of texts written between the 4th and 15th centuries by spiritual masters it serves as a guide to the contemplative life focusing on the practice of inner prayer the cultivation of virtues and the struggle against passions the term philokalia itself means love of the beautiful reflecting its goal of guiding believers towards the beauty of a life united with god compiled in the 18th century by st nikodemos of the holy mountain and st makarios of corinth the philokalia has profoundly influenced orthodox spirituality emphasizing the importance of prayer of the heart watchfulness and the unceasing remembrance of god its teachings continue to be a vital resource for those seeking spiritual growth and depth in their faith journey

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
